I am continuing to use Widla Gafney's A Women's Lectionary for the Whole Church for Worship Planning as the year continues. In addition, I am part of an Iowa focus group that is anticipating introducing a Lenten Study called A Palm Sunday Path that is a Progressive Christian Based Response, rooted in Matthew 25, to the current Immigration crackdown that is being rolled out across the nation. This will include Adult Study throughout Lent and culminate with a protest/rally/vigil at the state capital on Palm Sunday afternoon.

**Continuing Education Updates/Wider Denominational Meetings**

This semester I will be teaching an online Intro to World Religions course as an adjunct professor at Iowa Valley Community College. In addition, I will be writing six essays for publication in Liberating the Lectionary, an upcoming project with Tehom Center Publishing.

I have also been approached by Newton UCC about our congregations having further discussions about the possibility of mutual support and collaboration in the future as they are hoping to explore the future of their congregation as the current covenant they are in with their Lutheran neighbor church comes up for renewal.
